

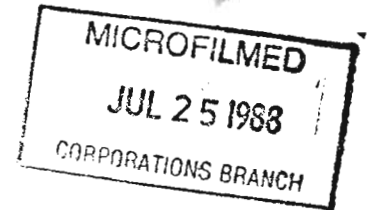

## PRAYERS

2:00 O'CLOCK P.M.

The following bills were, by leave, respectively introduced and read a First Time:

(No. 79) — The Engineering Profession Act; Loi sur les ingénieurs.

(Mr. FOX for Mr. DOERN)

(No. 72) — The Wild Rice Act; Loi sur le riz sauvage.

(Recommended by Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor)

(Hon. Mr. KOSTYRA for Hon. Mr. MACKLING)

Hon. Mr. PENNER moved:

THAT Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair and the House resolve itself into a Committee to consider of the Supply to be granted to Her Majesty.

And the Question being put,

It was agreed to.

The House accordingly resolved itself into Committee of Supply.

And the House continuing in Committee,

The Proceedings were interrupted at 4:30 p.m. for Private Members' Hour.

The House resumed the Adjourned Debate on the Proposed Motion of Mr. SCOTT:

THAT Bill (No. 38) — An Act to amend The Society of Management Accountants of Manitoba Act, be now read a Second Time.

And the debate continuing,

And Mr. McKENZIE having spoken,

And the Question being put,

It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly read a Second Time and referred to the Standing Committee on Private Bills.

Mr. GRAHAM moved:

13. WHEREAS YOUTH PARLIAMENT OF MANITOBA desires to incorporate under The Corporations Act of the Province of Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS the Director of Corporations of Manitoba will not allow the name Youth Parliament of Manitoba to be used unless a consent is obtained from the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba consents to the Youth Parliament of Manitoba incorporating under the name "Youth Parliament of Manitoba".

And a debate arising,

And Messrs. GRAHAM, FOX and ASHTON having spoken,

And the Question being put,

It was agreed to.

The Order of the Day being read for consideration of the Proposed Motion of Mr. EYLER:

6. WHEREAS, the Commons Committee on Alternative Energy concluded in 1981 that "Canada has a unique opportunity to become the world leader in hydrogen technologies if we follow an ambitious route to the early establishment of a hydrogen-based system", and

WHEREAS, the most promising method of producing hydrogen is by electricity, and

WHEREAS, Manitoba has both the cheapest electricity in Canada and large undeveloped potential, and

WHEREAS the Federal government is funding hydrogen research in Quebec, but not Manitoba,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this Legislative Assembly urge the federal government to fund hydrogen research in Manitoba where the economies of production are the most favourable in North America.

And the debate continuing,

And Mr. HARAPIAK continuing his address,

And Hon. Mr. PARASIUK and Mr. EYLER having spoken,

And the Question being put,

It was agreed to.
