Youth Parliament of Manitoba – 2018 Year-In-Review



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Part 1: Executive Summary

The Youth Parliament of Manitoba Inc. (YPM) 2018 fiscal year was a great success.

This year, we not only held our annual Winter Session from December 26-31, we also held the Western Canadian Youth Parliament (WCYP) from May 18-21. WCYP brings together members and alumni of the Youth Parliament of Manitoba, Saskatchewan Youth Parliament, TUXIS Parliament of Alberta, and the British Columbia Youth Parliament. It is held on a rotating, biannual basis across these four parliaments. Members from the other parliaments enjoyed the organization and structure of YPM, while also engaging in some contentious debate. Particularly, they found a bill written about sustainable burial and cremation practices to be especially thought-provoking.

Speaker's Night, our annual fundraising gala dinner, was widely enjoyed by those in attendance. We were pleased to welcome Susan Thompson, the first female mayor of Winnipeg, as our keynote speaker. She spoke about her own journey through politics and encouraged those in the audience to fight through adversity. Our Director of Finance, Abigaïl Theano-Pudwill, acted as Master of Ceremonies.

As always, the height of our year came at the 97th Winter Session. This year, we had 74 members attend, filling all the Legislative chamber beyond capacity. Members engaged in lively, often touching, debate on subjects ranging from mental health to drug policy to advertising ethics. Notably, a Private Member's Bill regarding food security in Northern Canada passed with a unanimous vote in the House.

We were particularly proud to expand the Reconciliation Fund this year to fully fund nine Indigenous youth to attend Winter Session. This fund covered registration, travel, food, and clothing if needed. YPM is deeply committed to reconciliation, particularly Call To Action #66 of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission that addresses youth programs. Indeed, this year our membership was nearly 20% Indigenous, almost reflecting the true demographics of Manitoba.

Dr. Aimée Craft, Professor of Law at the University of Ottawa, served as our Lieutenant Governor. Jerry Storrie, co-chair of the Association of Former Members of the Manitoba Legislation Assembly, served as our Honourary President. Throughout this year, we have also been proud to work with Elder Garry McLean. Garry served as our Elder Advisor, offering teachings to open and close the event, and a smudging to open the first day.

2018 was an excellent year for YPM Inc, and we hope to have many more in the future.
