The Prison Abolishment Act

WHEREAS "they (prisons) are instruments of social control" and

WHEREAS "More than one in ten men and nearly one in three women held in federal prisons have mental-health problems" and

WHEREAS "The "us" versus "them" machinery is stopped cold by the image of murderers playing board games."³

THEREFORE HER MAJESTY, BY AND WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE YOUTH PARLIAMENT OF MANITOBA, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) As of 01 January 2014, the Government of Canada shall establish Safe Indictment Maintaining People's right to Lenity and Enterprise [SIMPLE] in place of Canada's current prison system.
 - a) SIMPLE shall consist of communal rehabilitation facilities divided into four categories:
 - i) Deviant Behaviour Low Security
 - (1) Employees trained in safe restraint.
 - ii) Youth Deviant Behaviour Low Security
 - (1) For individuals under the age of Majority
 - (2) Employees trained in safe restraint.
 - iii) High-Risk Deviant Behaviour High Security
 - (1) Employees specialize in security and have additional training to monitor **SIMPLE** grounds.
 - iv) Mental Illness Low Security
 - (1) Employees trained in safe restraint.
- 2) **SIMPLE** facilities shall exist within municipal, town and city limits.
 - a) No barriers may be erected around SIMPLE facilities.
- 3) Criminal records will only be accessible to judiciary bodies, medical professionals, authorized **SIMPLE** personnel, and the indicted.
 - a) Names criminals will be considered confidential information and will not be released to the public.

- 4) All Low Security **SIMPLE** inmates will be allowed the right to seek employment in the community where the facility is located or within the **SIMPLE** facility.
 - a) High Security Inmates will be limited to the SIMPLE facility.
 - b) All employed inmates will receive full market value wages outside the facility and the provincial minimum wage within the facility.
 - c) In addition to the standard Income Tax, a progressive facility and program-upkeep tax, to be determined by the government of Canada, will be added to inmates' incomes to offset the cost of the prison system.
 - d) All inmates held at **SIMPLE** institutions will be subject to evaluation by a medical professional to determine whether their place of employment poses a risk to recovery.
 - i) If the workplace environment is determined to be harmful to patient recovery then employment will be terminated and the inmate will be compensated at 50% former wage rate until more suitable employment can be found.
 - (1) The 50% wage rate compensation may not fall below minimum wage.
- 5) Criminal sentences shall be limited to a maximum of 10 years after the first day of incarceration.
 - a) If an inmate is deemed rehabilitated by a parole board before their sentence has elapsed, then a judge may reduce their sentence.
 - b) Mental Illness patients are exempted from this stipulation.
 - i) Mental patients may be held indefinitely or until a medical professional assesses them as fit to re-join society.
- 6) **SIMPLE** facilities will provide secondary and post-secondary education to all inmates and patients based on community availability.
- 7) All Canadian citizens over the age of fifteen are required to complete 40 hours of volunteer service at a **SIMPLE** institution of their choice per year.
 - a) **SIMPLE** facility staff will be responsible for organizing tasks for volunteers.
