Alumni Achievement Award Winner: Dave Najduch

years on lower Cabinet, Dave presented legislation as the Minister of External Affairs in the 55th Session and the Minister of Education in the 56th Session. Bills were meant to be radical and spark debate - Dave remarks that YPM "let people play with ideas, and play with them in a safe environment". He was directly elected as the Premier of the 57th Session, and as the Speaker of the 58th Session. In addition to YPM, he also attended the first National Youth Parliament held in Ottawa in 1980, and several mini parliaments in Saskatchewan. In the 84th Session in 1985, Dave returned to YPM to serve as the Lieutenant-Governor. In December, Dave received the Alumni Achievement Award during the 99th Winter Session.

Dave joined the Youth Parliament of Manitoba as a backbencher in 1973. After two

After graduating with a B.Ed. from the University of Manitoba in 1981, Dave

Dave fondly remembers his years in YPM, particularly the evenings spent at the St.

embarked on a decades-long teaching career that took him from Birtle, MB to Trois Rivières, QC before eventually returning home to the Winnipeg School Divisions. For the next 35 years, he taught history, social studies, and law at high schools across the city including Tec Voc, Sisler High School, Grant Park High School, and the Winnipeg Adult Education Centre. As a teacher, he ran political workshops and mini parliaments for his classes. These events often featured other notable YPM alumni as guests and speakers, including Lloyd Axworthy and David Asper. During his long teaching career, Dave also spent 11 years as the President of the Winnipeg Teachers' Association. He retired earlier this year, after a 39-year career as an educator. When he thinks about how his time in YPM shaped his later life, Dave says, "Youth

Parliament has always been about service. But it doesn't always mean service in the norm of running for office. Lots of people went on to serve in other organizations, to work in their communities". Thank you, Dave, for your long years of service to your students and community.

Congratulations on receiving the Alumni Achievement Award, and on your welldeserved retirement.
