Recap: YPM's 100th Session!

YPM's 100th Session was historic not only for marking our centennial, but also for perhaps having the most tumultuous lead-up to Session, ever. On December 22nd (four days out!) we visited all the venues for an in-person Session and gala, planning set-up, testing microphones, and finalizing food deliveries. By the afternoon of December 24th, our gala was postponed and Session was changed to a completely virtual format. That two-day span saw *hours* of feverish late-night Zoom calls, countless emails, some tears, and ultimately, one of the best displays of teamwork I've ever had the privilege to participate in.

Despite these challenges, members who attended the 100th Session had a wonderful time. With the experience learned from the 99th Session last year, we were able to transition smoothly into the virtual format this year. Debate and question period was vibrant, with members clambering to speak on several controversial topics including the abolishment of Canada's military, mandatory organ donation, and nationalizing Canada's telecommunication services. After the scheduled activities, members continued to bond over conversation, games of trivia and *Hamilton* watch parties, often to the wee hours of the morning.

The success of Session this year relied entirely on the reliability and adaptability of so many people: the pages and clerks who patiently accommodated numerous lastminute scheduling changes, the Legislature staff who sacrificed their holidays to try and make our in-person Session happen, and **especially our members** who each brought incredibly positive attitudes to every day, even through the headaches and stiff necks brought on by hours of Zoom began to set in. The 100th Session may not have been quite what we had expected, but in a way it demonstrated the very characteristics that have allowed our organization to thrive over the past century: resilience in the face of difficulty, ability to adapt to new circumstances, and the unflagging enthusiasm that youth have for engaging in discourse about issues that matter to them.
