YPM and COVID-19

As organizations and corporations around the world adjust to the new normal created by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Youth Parliament of Manitoba is also considering changes to our usual operations. The health of our members and community is our top priority. As such, we have implemented the following safety measures.

- 1. **Speaker's Night**, our annual fundraising gala dinner, will be rescheduled.
- Originally planned for mid-July, we have decided to postpone the event. In the Fall, we will revisit this issue, potentially holding the event as provincial guidelines and public health allow.
- 2. YPM is conducting all business online until further notice. Last month, we held our first-ever virtual AGM over Zoom. Attendance was exceptional - with over 30 members present, it was the highest-attended AGM in recent history. This month, we will conduct virtual **Cabinet interviews**. Depending on provincial guidelines, we are also prepared to begin virtual Cabinet meetings in the Fall.
- 3. Winter Session is an inherently risky event, with members sleeping, eating, and working in close quarters. We will be closely monitoring COVID-19 developments until December and planning ways to implement heightened sanitation practices and distancing measures at the 99th Winter Session.

Alumni Spotlight - Bill Shaddy (53rd-57th Session)

Mr. Bill Shaddy was a member of YPM from 1974 to 1978, attending the 53rd to 57th Winter Sessions. In particular, Bill served as the Secretary of State in the 56th Session. He went on to graduate from the University of Manitoba in 1981, with a B.Comm (Hons). His subsequent 20-year business career included several years in Canada, followed by 17 years with the International Operations of PepsiCo. This management opportunity took him throughout Europe, the Middle East, and Asia. His most memorable accomplishments include establishing the PepsiCo India business 30 years ago and the re-structuring of the Russia business after the collapse of the USSR.

He credits YPM with teaching key skills including cross-cultural sensitivity, analytical thinking, public speaking, personal/professional integrity, and interpersonal teamwork abilities. He is currently retired and living in Florida. Each December, he remembers family and friends in Winnipeg, and of course his time in YPM!
